Boutique elegance at Belmond Cadogan, Chelsea's finest townhouse hotel



When staying in London, head for Chelsea and book into Belmond Cadogan on Sloane Street. The 54-bedroom hotel, which opened in February, is Belmond's second UK hotel bringing boutique elegance to London; a fitting town cousin to Le Manoir aux Quat'Saisons in Oxfordshire (see page 19).

The building has a rich history with connections to the actress and royal mistress, Lily Langtry. There is still a discreet back entrance that will favour those who, like the Victorian Prince of Wales, wish to remain low profile! After its recent £36 million refurbishment, the decor is stylish and modern but respectful of the building's architecture producing the feel of a private townhouse steeped with British old-world elegance. Highlights include haute cuisine delivered by Chef patron, Adam Handling.

Rocco Forte Hotels expands its collection in Italy and Sicily



The extraordinary talents of the Forte family under the inspirational chairmanship of Sir Rocco Forte and Olga Polizzi is reflected in a raft of new openings across this year and next in Rome, Puglia and Palermo, doubling their portfolio in Italy.

The Eternal City welcomes a second Rocco Forte hotel with the opening of **Hotel De La Ville**, lovingly created out of a 19th-century palace on the Via Sistina, atop the Trinita dei Monti, with sweeping views over city, especially from the rooftop terrace bar. The recently opened **Masseria Torre Maiza** in Puglia represents the group's second Rocco Forte Resort, offering 40 suites reflecting the inspirational stamp of Olga Polizzi. Finally, in 2020, and after a two-year, €27m undertaking, **Villa Igiea**, Palermo's finest hotel will re-open its doors.

Ocean to Ocean on Africa's Copper Trail - luxury rail travel for the intrepid



During July and August 2019 Rovos Rail will run a new 15-day expedition traversing Tanzania, Zambia, the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) and Angola. It will be the first time in history that a passenger train will travel the famous east-to-west copper trail on this route.

The preparation for this exciting itinerary out of Dar es Salaam took two years of careful planning and acquiring permission from the respective authorities. With visits to both Tanzania's Selous Reserve and a fly-in two-night safari in the South Luangwa National Park (Zambia) the journey has its premium wildlife moments as well as a city tour of Lubumbashi (DRC). Thereafter it joins the Benguela line for short walking tours detailing Angola's recent history with journey's end in Lobito.

Brexit - What's it means for European travel

Will flights still operate?

Regardless of the Brexit outcome planes will still fly between the UK and the EU. If a deal is agreed then we will be in a transition period, meaning everything will stay the same until the end of December 2020 and flights will continue as normal. Even if there is a no-deal scenario, the European Commission has said that UK airlines will still be able to operate flights between the UK and the EU. The UK government has offered similar assurances for EU airlines.

Will ferries and cruise ships still sail?

Ferry services and cruises will still sail as the majority of the rules under which they operate are not based on EU rules, but are international.

Should I take out travel insurance to cover Brexit?

The best way to protect your holiday is to book a package – it is the travel provider's responsibility to make sure a holiday is provided and to offer an alternative or refund if it cannot be delivered.

EHIC and personal travel insurance

The European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) allows any EU citizen to access state medical care when they are travelling in another EU country. In the event of a no-deal Brexit, UK registered EHICs will no longer be valid. In any event it is recommended that travellers take supplementary travel insurance.







Three minutes grace

The Balmoral
Edinburgh

Opened in 1902, it was acclaimed as one of the great railway hotels lying adjacent to Waverley Railway Station in the heart of Edinburgh at the border of Old Town and New Town. Formerly *The North British*, the hotel, renamed *The Balmoral*, became the first acquisition in the impressive Rocco Forte Collection in 1997. This flagship property has been lavishly renovated and embellished during the following 20 years and features 188 bedrooms and suites together with fine dining at the Michelin-starred, Number One Restaurant. Recalling the building’s railway legacy, the time on the clock face of the iconic clock tower is set precisely three minutes fast, so that you don’t miss your train. In fact, the only time the clock is set correctly is over Hogmanay.



A Wilde suggestion

L'oscar London
Holborn, London WC1

Reassuringly central, yet hidden from the bustle of capital streets, the 39-bedroom hotel can be found in the centre of literary London close to the City, to Theatreland, to Soho and the West End. L'oscar London is an extravagantly restored building, created from a breath-taking Baroque-style, grade II listed former Baptist chapel in Holborn. Styled by Jacques Garcia, the interiors exhibit a hint of irreverence, a nod towards decadence and a touch of the risqué.

An exhilarating dining experience awaits guests in the Baptist Grill, one of the most iconic venues in the capital, where opulence and temptation combine in the domed chapel under the expert guidance of renowned Executive Chef Tony Fleming.

- **Lucknam Park Hotel & Spa**
Colerne, Near Chippenham, Wiltshire

If you are looking for both glamorous and English country traditional then this big-hitting Cotswold 500-acre estate will not disappoint. As you first approach down the mile-long tree-lined avenue, bordered by sweeping gardens, towards the elegant, honey-stoned front facade, you really should be in a horse drawn carriage discussing the marriage prospects of your five eligible daughters. But putting Jane Austin aside Lucknam Park, for all its classic trappings, is a quintessential weekend retreat, where tired cosmopolitan types can come for proper peace and quiet, where relaxation starts with soothing downtime in the ESPA spa followed by a mouth-watering meal at the main restaurant enjoying michelin star cuisine by Hywel Jones before retiring for a well-earned good night's sleep, perhaps in one of the swagged four posters in one of the larger rooms. Definitely a great place to stay for a visit to Bath.

Add to this a determination to get it just right regardless of how long it would take before opening - 6 years overdue! - and you will probably realise why Heckfield Place, a renovated Georgian mansion, has become one of the UK's most anticipated country house hotel openings. Unassuming from the exterior, the hotel is an amazing statement in understated excellence where contemporary and antique sit in measured balance, where the estate grown fare defines the cuisine and where urban simplicity draws the guest to appreciate the beauty of the magnificent parklands.



High society in the Surrey Hills

- **Beaverbrook**
Near Leatherhead, Surrey

This Surrey Hills Country Estate, former home of Lord Beaverbrook, is set in 400 acres and has been transformed into a lavish hotel that exudes charm and eccentricity.

Steeped in history, each of the beautifully appointed bedrooms in The House nod towards past guests - Elizabeth Taylor, Rudyard Kipling, Ian Fleming and Sir Winston Churchill were frequent visitors to the Estate. Choose to stay in either The House, with interiors designed by Susie Atkinson, or The Garden House, with stunning country interiors by Nicola Harding. In The Garden House, there is an Anglo-Italian restaurant and a unique cookery school, while in The House, an ex-Nobu chef runs The Japanese Grill. The Coach House Spa offers treatment rooms, indoor and outdoor pools, a gym and a deli offering healthy food options. The Orangery is a haven for children to escape the parents at weekends and is transformed during the week into an ideal meeting space.



In search of the sublime

- **Belmond Le Manoir aux Quat'Saisons**
Great Milton, Oxfordshire

Nestled in the picturesque Oxfordshire countryside, Belmond Le Manoir aux Quat'Saisons has been the touchstone of haute cuisine for over three decades. Yet its prestige is not limited to the dining room. This 15th-century former manor champions what maître de maison, Raymond Blanc OBE, would call *l'art de vivre*. "The good does not interest us," he says, "only the sublime."

His passion permeates through the hotel, from the individually designed suites to the restaurant's seven-course tasting menus. Just a year after he created Belmond Le Manoir aux Quat'Saisons in 1984, it was awarded two Michelin stars. Today, it is Britain's only country house hotel to have held this badge of honour for over 30 years.
